## **Initial Assessment Questions**

If the answer to any of the initial assessment questions **is no** an individual risk assessment is required to establish whether the pupil will be able to have their needs met at home, and be safer there than attending an educational setting/school.

The local authorities and education settings should decide together who is best placed to undertake the risk assessment, noting that the duty to secure provision remains with the local authority. Where the risk assessment determines a child or young person with an EHC plan will be safer at home; the Department for Education (DfE) recommends they stay at home. Where the risk assessment determines a child or young person with an EHC plan will be as safe or safer at an education setting, DfE recommends they attend the education setting.
